
I am requesting \$1,500,000 in funding for the City of Barberton Justice Center Technology and Equipment Project in fiscal year 2026. The entity to receive funding for this project is City of Barberton located at 576 W Park Ave, Barberton, OH 44203. The funding would be used to install new IT, security and AV equipment throughout the Police Department section of the Barberton Justice Center.

The project is an appropriate use of taxpayer funds because the Barberton Police Department is responsible for providing policing services to all of Barberton's residents, as well as all businesses and visitors to the City. Thus, it will enable the Barberton Police Department's equipment and IT infrastructure to be upgraded to modern day standards as the entire facility is converted to a renovated Justice Center.
